JA Connect is Junior Achievement's first self-guided student experience, featuring a flexible, modular repository of activities related to work and career readiness. The online activities give students an opportunity to acquire knowledge and to apply and practice new skills and behaviors inside or outside of the classroom. The content is relevant to JA Career Success® and other JA learning experiences in the Work and Career Readiness Pathway, and extends or enhances classroom content. The self-guided activities can also be used independent from a JA learning experiences.

JA Connect will become a key component of a badging and certification learning experience because it will allow students to develop and demonstrate skills and behaviors within each competency at increasing levels of difficulty. Content related to JA's financial literacy and entrepreneurship competencies are being added.

JA CONNECT DESCRIPTION

- JA Work and Career Readiness Pathway
- Placement: Grades 9–12, in-school, after-school, or out-of-school
- Students can engage with JA Connect multiple times during and after completion of a JA learning experience.
- Volunteers are not required.
